Dr G. Keith Still is a crowd risk analysis specialist who has lectured at the UK Cabinet Office Emergency Planning College contributing to their crowd safety-related courses. Keith is now is the Professor of Crowd Science at Manchester Metropolitan University (UK).

In this executive briefing Prof. Still outlines the principles and applications of crowd dynamics and how to use this approach to develop more robust crowd safety plans.
